#### **BALANCE Is Always Key!**

I enjoy gardening. Recently I was applying a new fertilizer to my tomatoes. The directions cautioned the importance of balancing the application of water with fertilizer. If you apply too much fertilizer and not enough water, you risk burning the plant and impeding the growth you intended. Conversely if you do not apply enough nutrients and over water the plant you may end up with yellowed leaves at best or at worst root rot. Balancing the two is key in maintaining good plant health.

Proverbs 3:1-6 (NKJV) says.

¹My son, do not forget my law, but let your heart keep my commands; ²for length of days and long life and peace they will add to you. ³Let not mercy and truth forsake you; bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart, ⁴and so find favor and [a]high esteem In the sight of God and man. ⁵Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; ⁵In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall [b]direct your paths

In verse three I bolded the words "mercy" and "truth." In this passage Solomon was advising his son to keep God's law. He admonished him to bind mercy and truth around his neck and write them on the tablet of his heart, and then to trust God with all his strength and understanding.

Truth and Mercy may sometimes seem to stand at odds with each other. Yet, these two seemingly contradictory words are intertwined and interdependent in our faith journey. Truth exposes the severity and consequence of our sin, and mercy or grace reveals the antidote for our sin debt. One writer I read recently said it this way:

**Without truth**, there can be no mercy. Without honesty, there can be no forgiveness. Without knowledge of sin, there can be no forgiveness of sin. On the flip side of the same coin, **without mercy**, truth becomes overwhelming and overbearing. With no hope for mercy, truth is resisted and often rejected.

Jesus embodied both these qualities with perfect balance. He was/ is the truth and life (John 14:6, Heb. 4:12) and the great grace giver (Eph 2:8-9, Rom. 3:24). Jesus exercised judgement as he cast out the money changers from the temple (Matt. 21:12-13), yet he dispensed mercy to the one caught in adultery (John 8).

We must seek balance as we incorporate and express these two virtues in our lives. If we lean too much towards truth, we become pharisaical, ignoring the person while handing out guilty sentences to all who would offend us. If we are too gracious, we may be warm and welcoming but lack truth that brings about the conviction of sin.

One devotion writer I read this week said it best in the following:

Some churches today embrace truth but need a heavy dose of grace. Other churches talk about grace but cry out for a heavy dose of truth.

I invited a lesbian activist to lunch. For the first hour, she hammered me, telling of all the Christians who'd mistreated her. She seemed hard as nails. I listened, trying to show her God's grace, praying she'd see the Jesus she desperately needed. She raised her voice and cursed freely. People stared. But that was OK. Jesus went to the cross for her—the least I could do was listen.

Suddenly she was crying, sobbing, broken. I reached across the table and took her hand. For the next two hours I heard her story, her heartsickness, her doubts about the causes she championed. I told her about Christ's grace. After four hours we walked out of that restaurant, side by side. We hugged. In our conversation, truth wasn't shared at the expense of grace, nor grace at the expense of truth.

Birds need two wings to fly. With only one wing, they're grounded. The gospel flies with the wings of grace and truth. Not one, but both.

May we be truth and grace bearers in the days ahead as we carry the name of Christ to a world that desperately needs to see both!




