THE SCARLET THREAD

In March, the choir will be singing a selection entitled "Holding on to Me" written by Jeremy Horn and Ryan Wingo and arranged by Josh Stewart. The song references the expression "the scarlet thread." A choir member asked me to share about the Biblical significance of the scarlet thread as we prepare to sing it in worship. That request prompted me to do some research.

Often as Christians we look at the Bible in bits and pieces. As children we read stories and sing songs about the heroes of faith like Noah, Abraham, Moses, Joshua, David, Esther, and countless others. We study the parables of Jesus, His miracles, His earthly ministry, and His death, resurrection, and ascension. Yet we do so in somewhat of a hodge podge approach, viewing each story or admonition in Scripture in isolation, missing the overarching link that weaves them all into one love story from God, the Creator and Redeemer of humankind.

God created mankind to have full and uninterrupted fellowship and communication with Him. He formed the first man and woman and placed them in an ideal state, The Garden of Eden. In Genesis 2:15, we find Adam's job was to work and take care of the garden. One translation says he was to "cultivate and keep it." In an article published December 29, 2023, by the Israel Institute of Biblical Studies, Dr. Eli Lizorkin-Eyzenberg explains in the original Hebrew translation "cultivate and keep" means to work the soil and care for its produce. However, an alternate translation of these words means to "worship and obey." He writes, "Based on the context of Genesis, it's reasonable to assume that both pairs of meanings are at play: **God places Adam in the garden not only to help the land flourish, but also to maintain a worshipful and obedient relationship** with the Lord."

Adam was tasked with not only providing for him and Eve physically, but he was also to lead them spiritually as they related to their Creator. Of course, we know sin (rebellion against God's law) entered the picture and messed everything up. Adam and Eve, in eating the forbidden fruit, was the initial downfall of their entrusted stewardship that brought separation between them and God. However, God in Genesis 3 provides the first redemptive act to bring them back into right fellowship with Him. The severity of their disobedience demanded death. Genesis 3:21 relates that God clothed them in animal skins revealing a substitutionary sacrifice for their sins. Thus, the scarlet thread begins.

On New Year's Eve 1961 Dr. W. A. Criswell, pastor of First Baptist Church, Dallas, Texas from 1944-1991 preached a five-hour sermon entitled "The Scarlet Thread that Runs through the Bible."

The sermon was later published in a book by that title. He explains it this way:

A scarlet thread winds its way throughout the entire Bible. Believers throughout the centuries have seen this line of crimson weaving through every book of God's holy Word. It is the story of redemption of mankind at the price of the blood of Jesus Christ.

This redemptive story is woven in the fabric of the stories and genealogical history in the Bible as related in the Old Testament and coming to full fruition in the New Testament Gospels. One such anecdote, The Scarlet Thread in the Day of Atonement, is recorded in Leviticus 16. Yom Kippur (The Day of Atonement) involves a ritual with two goats. One goat is sacrificed and the other, the "scapegoat," is sent into the wilderness after the high priest lays the sins of the people on it. A scarlet thread is tied around the goat before sending it on its way. This points to God's plan of redemption, mercy, and salvation ultimately found in Jesus Christ, the final sacrifice for sin.

As we approach the observance of the Lord's Supper on February 23 and the weeks leading up to Good Friday and Easter Sunday in April, may we remember and thank God for His unmerited favor. May we also be compelled to share this Good News with others.




