## A Legacy of Faith

What constitutes a legacy? Well, when in doubt, ask Google. The word has two meanings. First is an amount of money or property left to someone in a will. The second is the long-lasting impact of particular events, actions, etc., that took place in the past, or of a person's life.

Many of you know that in February Evelyn's mother passed away. Evelyn's parents resided in the same house in rural south Alabama since their marriage in 1958. We are now engaged in the exhausting task of sifting through and dispensing various articles which were accumulated over a sixty plus year period of farming and housekeeping. *(continued, next column)* 

We have discovered a variety of interesting items, many of which were packed away in closets, under beds, in storage rooms, and in barns. The sheer volume of items is sometimes overwhelming! We have dispersed a good many of the items in the house (dishes, furniture, bedding, etc.,) however, there is still a staggering amount to examine.

My mother-in-law and father-in-law were from the "waste not, want not" generation. They grew up in the Great Depression. They saved everything, as it might be of use later, especially in the farming environment. There are hundreds of Mason Jars, plastic jugs, scraps of fabric, clothes to be mended, various sewing paraphernalia, magazines that date back to the 1950's, and this is just inside the house. We have barely made a dent in cleaning out under the barns and sheds.

There are numerous intriguing items we have found. There are cards and letters written over the past sixty plus years to Evelyn's parents from various people, including their children. These tell a family story which Evelyn hopes to sort into some type of documentary format to pass down to future generations.

One such piece I saw sitting on our counter after our most recent trip south was a photo of Castleberry Baptist Church. Her mother's family were members of that church since the early 1900's. It was the church in which Evelyn and her two brothers were spiritually nourished. She has fond memories of men and women of faith who poured into her as a child, teenager, and later as an adult. As I gazed at the photo I could visualize many of those people of faith: Mrs. Marie Pate, Mrs. Lecroy, Mr. and Mrs. Hardin, her uncle and aunt June and Maxine Ellis, Rev. and Mrs. Wiggers, Rev. and Mrs. Godbee, her mother, and many others. That snapshot represents more than a physical building-rather a season in which God's people nurtured and encouraged three children, teens, and adults on their spiritual journey. Their impact had eternal significance.

The song recorded by Steve Green comes to mind as I reflect on these things. The third stanza and chorus are bold reminders of the importance of leaving a legacy of faith.

After all our hopes and dreams have come and gone, And our children sift through all we've left behind. May the clues that they discover and the memories they uncover, Become the light that leads them to the road we each must find.

Oh, may all who come behind us find us faithful.
May the fire of our devotion light their way.
May the footprints that we leave lead them to believe,
And the lives we live inspire them to obey.
Oh, may all who come behind us find us faithful!

Paul in II Timothy 1:5 exhorts Timothy by reminding him of the faith that first dwelt in his grandmother, Lois, and then in his mother, Eunice, and in him also. The faith exemplified in these two women impacted young Timothy along his spiritual journey.

May we be reminded that our most important legacy is not in the amount of money or things we leave our children and grandchildren, but rather the spiritual seeds sown that will produce eternal fruit.

#### ALABAMA BAPTIST STATE CONVENTION


The 2025 Annual Meeting of the Alabama Baptist State Convention will be held at Whitesburg Baptist Church in Huntsville on November 11-12.
