I recall an Andy Griffith episode where a visiting pastor from New York preaches for the locals. Andy, Barney, Aunt Bea, Clara, and Gomer all listen intently (except for Gomer who keeps nodding off) as the pastor reprimands the congregation for their societal busyness. He encourages them to slow down and enjoy the simpler things. He prompts them to remember the days of sitting in the park on Sunday afternoons enjoying a community band concert.

After lunch, while sitting on the front porch, Andy and his clan discuss the merits of the sermon. They recall the band concerts in the park. Upon further discussion, they decided to put on a band concert so that everyone could come together and enjoy a relaxing Sunday afternoon in the park. Soon they were in full out plan and initiation mode. Andy would pull the band together to rehearse, Aunt Bea and Clara would freshen up the old band

The ramshackle gazebo is a disaster and no amount of shoring up can save it in time.

Soon tempers flare, exhaustion sets in and they all collapse into chairs on Andy's front porch. It is about this time that Rev. Tucker drops by with the esteemed New York pastor. The visiting pastor sees Andy and the gang relaxing on the front porch and interprets this to mean they have taken his advice to slow down and enjoy a calm and serene afternoon. He commends them for their efforts. When invited to join them and have a cup of coffee, the pastor says he must rush off for another speaking engagement in Raleigh.

This comical episode, though encapsulated in a thirty-minute drama, bears a bit of truth. Often our best laid plans fall short. 
