The Grace of Gratitude

It is good to give thanks to the Lord. Psalm 92:1

Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His love endures forever. Psalm 107:1

The Pilgrim Fathers who landed at Plymouth in Massachusetts in 1620 knew nothing of what was ahead of them in the New World. There were 102 passengers that sailed from Plymouth, England on the Mayflower. Their journey was long and treacherous, and it lasted over 2 months. They knew nothing of the bountiful prosperity that so many people enjoy today. Many of them were separatists, Christians who had broken away from the Church of England to worship freely. They were trusting God and were excited to find their new freedom in their worship. The Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock in present-day Massachusetts.

The days ahead were very difficult but their lives were marked by a spirit of constant thankfulness. The first Winter was brutal: half of the settlers died from cold, hunger, and disease. There were seven times as many graves dug for the dead as homes were built for the living. Despite these losses, they persevered, relying on their faith in God and mutual support.

In spring 1621, the Pilgrims met the Wampanoag people, who taught them how to plant corn, fish, and survive in the new environment. Their determination to worship freely and their reliance on God's provision shaped the spiritual and cultural foundation of early America. Today, their journey is honored as a symbol of courage and thanksgiving.

As we look back on our beginnings in North America, it is hard to imagine what they endured to be able to worship and have the freedom that they were looking for. It seems as though it would be hard to be positive and trust God in times like those. As we see how they responded, their faith never wavered. It only grew stronger. Today our faith and our dependence on God seems so small. I hope that during this Thanksgiving Season we can truly see how much we have to be thankful for and that our faith in God will grow even stronger as we depend on Him more and less on our abilities. *God is Good, all the time!*




